Free public transport offer: Free public transport travel is available to bushfire affected people until 1 October 2009. Free travel is available on all public transport services in Victoria, including metropolitan trains, trams and buses and V/Line trains and coaches and town bus services. Previously, people needed a blue form to access this offer. People can now provide any one of three documents:

- a letter from their case manager stating the client was affected by the bushfires
- a Bushfire Appeals Fund grant letter, stating they have received a grant, or
- the blue form.

Australian Taxation Office assistance: In an effort to ease the burden on people suffering personal and financial loss at this time, the ATO can help with any concerns clients might have about tax, including:

- fast tracking refunds
- giving clients extra time to pay debts
- giving clients more time to meet activity statement, income tax and other lodgement obligations
- helping to reconstruct tax records where documents have been destroyed, and make reasonable estimates where necessary
- helping clients who are experiencing serious hardship
